SUMMER RESEARCH OPPORTUNITY FOR ADVANCED HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

RMP is a six-week residential and commuter summer program that engages qualified, high-achieving high school students from all over the world in interdisciplinary, hands-on, university-level research. In addition to gaining a deep relationship with their mentor and the academic benefits, the students will be immersed in university life and will network with equally ambitious and curious peers.

Students earn **8 university credits** while gaining cutting-edge university-level research experience. RMP provides interdisciplinary research projects under the guidance of UCSB researchers.

GRIT talks – will connect students to some of the best minds among the UCSB research community who present on their ground-breaking research and innovative technology. Speakers have included: Nobel Laureates Alan Heeger and Finn Kydland; and Professors Gretchen Hoffman, JoAnn Kuchera-Morin, and Michael Mahan.

DATES: June 24 – August 4, 2018

Program Eligibility

- Open to mature students in the 10th and 11th grades*
- Completed a minimum of 12 academic semester courses
- Minimum 3.8 GPA (weighted, UC a–g requirements)
- Must attend the program in its entirety

*Outstanding 9th grade students accepted only on case-by-case basis

Requirements

- Online application (window December 15 – March 15)
- Personal statement (500 word maximum)
- Writing sample from current academic year (3 pg. maximum)
- Recommendations from 2 teachers (online)
- Official high school transcript
- Official AP scores (if applicable)
- Scholarship application (if applicable)
