Information on National Human Trafficking Prevention Month and Human Trafficking Awareness Day:

January is designated as National Human Trafficking Prevention Month. Human Trafficking is one of the fastest growing crimes in the world and is on the rise in the United States. California has the nation's highest number of reported incidents of human trafficking.

The Bay Area, including Monterey County, with its trucking and agricultural industries along the 101 Corridor is identified as one of the three highest-intensity child sex trafficking regions. Approved the Annual Financial Report Prepared by Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP:

Ms. Samantha Moore from Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP presented the audited financial statements for the 2016-2017 fiscal year. Each year, school districts are required to have an external audit. In accordance with Ed. Code section 41020.3, the District has posted the audited 2016-17 financial statements for public review with Board approval. The district did not have any material findings and had a very good audit report.

P-1 Attendance Report for the 2017-2018 School Year:

The District reports official attendance to the State at three intervals: P-1, P-2, and P-Annual. While all State funding is tied to the P-2 report, the District is providing this informational report to the Board on the results of the P-1 attendance-reporting period (August 2017 through December 2017). The grade level and school reports for attendance are also provided. The goal is at least 95% attendance in each grade, school and district-wide. Independent Study reports positive attendance based upon work completion rates. ([See Attendance Reports Here](#))

Approved Projected Enrollment Numbers for 2018-2019:

Each year, the District is required to establish enrollment. The method for determining the 2018-19 enrollment projections is as follows:

- Total enrollment by grade span at each school is determined by matriculating students to the next grade level and by assuming that there will be the same number of incoming Kindergarten students.
- Transitional Kindergarten students are estimated by averaging the number of enrolled TK's over the last four years.

Approved Resolution #2017-1811 for the Dissolution of the Salinas Area Youth Drug Information/Crisis Center Joint Powers Authority:

The District has participated as a member of the Salinas Area Youth Drug Information Crisis Center (known as the Sunrise House), a Joint Powers Authority. The Sunrise House JPA Board decided that the JPA should be dissolved and the services will be provided to districts by other existing agencies. The NMCUSD Board approved the resolution authorizing a district representative to vote to dissolve the Salinas Area Youth Drug Information Crisis Center and sign the JPA Dissolution Agreement. The district is a member of the Community Human Services JPA who provides services to students and families in addition to other partnerships with other organizations who will work to provide like services.
