## Report on 2016-2017 spring 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester and 2017-2018 Fall 1<sup>st</sup> Semester Grades For North Monterey County High School and Middle School Quarter Grades:

Grades are an important academic achievement measure and in particular passing with a "C" or better is essential to ensure students are mastering key standards and skills and in specific courses, earning A-G credits. The LCAP goals have grades as a outcome measure for Math in grades 7-12, completion of A-G courses, literacy as indicated in English Language Arts and to ensure students are able to graduate.

When 25% or more of a group of students have Ds and/or Fs in a particular course or classroom, there are programmatic needs that must be addressed. When there are 25% or more courses that have Ds and/or Fs the issue is systemic and must be addressed school wide. ([See D and F Grade Reports Fall 2017-2018 HERE](#))

**Approved the School Year Academic Calendar for 2018-2019:** The NMCUSD Calendar Committee met on January 18, 2018 to discuss and plan out the 2018-2019 proposed academic calendar. This committee worked to develop an academic calendar that meets legal guidelines,

### **Approved Classroom Staffing Projections for 2018-2019:**

Classroom staffing projections are based upon approved enrollment projections (Board meeting January 11, 2018), and staffing ratios/formulas per the NMCFT bargaining agreement for the 2018-2019 school year. Actual enrollment and site capacity ultimately impact the projected staffing for each campus. The total number of classroom staffing position may be adjusted based upon changes in actual enrollment. Typically adjustments are made to classroom staffing projections in May, late July/early August, and in early September.

### **Received Report on Leaves and the District's Plan for Support**

This report is intended to update the Board on the Leaves taken during the Fall 2017. The report provided information regarding the number and types of leaves taken, by the day of week and fulfillment of coverage by month. This report includes actions to address the need for substitute coverage and next steps to continue to improve this area of operations.

### **Review/ Public Hearing: Updated Board Policies, Administrative Regulations and Board Bylaws**

As recommended, the District worked with California School Boards Association (CSBA) to update all Board Policies, Administrative Regulations and Board Bylaws to ensure aligned with new legislation and requirements. The updated draft policies were reviewed over a three-day period of time in July and specific ones reflecting any recent changes between July and December 2017. The updated policies were formatted by CSBA and returned to the District for review. This was an information item at the January 25, 2018 regular board meeting.

A public hearing was conducted at the February 8, 2018 regular board meeting. Final adoption of the updated policies will be on the regular board meeting agenda on February 22, 2018. A hard copy of the updated policies is available for public review at the North Monterey County Unified School District office located at 8142 Moss Landing Road, Moss Landing between the hours of 8:00 AM and 4:00 PM Monday through Friday.
