Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to inform you that the North Monterey County Unified School District will be continuing the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for 2021-2022 School Year, an option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

What does this mean for you and your children attending a North Monterey County Unified School District Site?

Great news for you and your students! All enrolled students in our school district, regardless of income level, are eligible to receive healthy school meals at **no charge** each day. Further, meal applications are NOT required.

School meals are a great value and convenience for busy families. We request that you speak with your children to encourage them to eat their school breakfast and lunch every day to ensure the sustainability of this program. The district looks forward to serving nutritious, well-balanced meals to your children all year long for free!
